



- Subjects: 167
 - Alive and well: 136
 - Alive and injured: 10
 - Located deceased: 14
 - Suicide: 3
 - Accidental (falling, hypothermia, drowning, aircraft crash, etc): 11
 - Unable to locate: 9
 - ELT/PLB Signal: 3
 - Unknown circumstance – 6
 - Missing Hunter/Camper/Walkaway - 3
 - Possible criminal activity: 1
 - Unknown assistance – 2

New Mexico Administrative Code

Title 10 - Public Safety and Law Enforcement

Chapter 24 - Search and Rescue

Part 1 - Certification for Search and Rescue Persons

NM Administrative code 10.24.1

NM Administrative code 10.24.1

- ▶ What is NM Administrative code 10.24.1?
 - ▶ Administrative code (rule) which governs the certification of SAR volunteers
 - ▶ Enacted June 27, 2017

NM Administrative code 10.24.1

- ▶ Three levels of certification
 - ▶ Certification of SAR person or Volunteer
 - ▶ Basic Field Certification
 - ▶ Certification for Incident Command General Staff
 - ▶ Operations Section Chief
 - ▶ Planning Section Chief
 - ▶ Logistics Section Chief
 - ▶ Certification for Field Coordinator
 - ▶ Incident Commander

NM Administrative code 10.24.1

- ▶ Within each category of certification, the SAR person will need to perform maintenance of certification in order to keep certifications

NM Administrative code 10.24.1

- ▶ **Maintenance of certification for field coordinator:**
 - ▶ Annual maintenance training is required to maintain field coordinator certification.
 - ▶ The maintenance of certification training programs for field coordinators shall provide a minimum total of eight hours of training.
 - ▶ Any field coordinator that is unable to complete the maintenance of certification training within the year will be placed on probation status and must attend the next maintenance of certification training provided in order to be removed from probation status.
 - ▶ If the maintenance of certification training is not completed within the next 12 months, it shall be basis for removal from the field coordinator position and from certification as field coordinator.
 - ▶ A certification that is on probation status is still active and valid unless the certification is suspended or has been revoked.

NM Administrative code 10.24.1

- ▶ **Maintenance of certification for incident command system general staff:**
 - ▶ Training is required every three years to maintain incident command system general staff certification.
 - ▶ The maintenance of certification training programs for the incident command system general staff shall provide a minimum total of eight hours of training.
 - ▶ Any person certified in an incident command system general staff position that is unable to complete the maintenance of certification training within the year after it becomes due will have his or her certification placed on probation status and must attend the next maintenance of certification training provided in order to be removed from probation status.
 - ▶ If the maintenance of certification training is not completed within the next 12 months after it is due, it shall be basis for removal from incident command system general staff certification status.
 - ▶ A certification that is on probation status is still active and valid unless the certification is suspended or has been revoked.

NM Administrative code 10.24.1

- ▶ **Maintenance of certification for SAR persons or volunteers:**
 - ▶ Training is required every three years to maintain SAR person or volunteer certification.
 - ▶ The maintenance of certification training programs for SAR persons or volunteers shall provide a minimum total of two hours of on-line training or in person training.
 - ▶ If the maintenance of certification training is not completed within the three-year period, the certification will be placed on probation status.
 - ▶ If the maintenance of certification training is not completed within the next 12 months after it is due, it shall be basis for removal from SAR person or volunteer certification status.
 - ▶ A certification that is on probation status is still active and valid unless the certification is suspended or has been revoked.

NM Administrative code 10.24.1

- ▶ Summary of certification maintenance
 - ▶ Field Coordinators certification maintenance
 - ▶ Eight hours of training every year
 - ▶ Miss the annual requirement, one year grace period to obtain required training
 - ▶ General Staff certification maintenance
 - ▶ Eight hours of training over a three year period
 - ▶ Miss the three year requirement, one year grace period to obtain the needed number of hours
 - ▶ SAR person certification maintenance
 - ▶ Two hours of training over a three year period
 - ▶ Miss the three year requirement, one year grace period to obtain the needed number of hours

Training courses

- ▶ Currently, the only approved courses that meet the maintenance requirements include:
 - ▶ Basic Field Cert - 8 hours
 - ▶ SAR Section Chief courses - 16+ hours
 - ▶ SAR Incident Management course - 20 hours
 - ▶ SAR Safety Officer course - 4 hours
 - ▶ SAR Field Coordinator Rendezvous - 8 hours
 - ▶ SAR Incident Action Plan course - 2 hours
 - ▶ Land navigation - 16 hours
 - ▶ Introduction to SAR Management - 4 hours

Training courses

- ▶ Other approved courses:
 - ▶ Search Techniques - 1 hour
 - ▶ SAR Communications - 1 hour
 - ▶ Safety in SAR - 1 hour
 - ▶ Gear and clothing - 1 hour
 - ▶ Basic map and compass - 1 hour
- ▶ Courses in development that will be approved
 - ▶ SAR Field Team Leader course

Training courses

- ▶ With approval from the SRB, other courses may be considered*
 - ▶ Emergency Management Institute on-line training
 - ▶ Outside agencies SAR trainings
 - ▶ NMDHS&EM sponsored trainings
 - ▶ SAR organizations' trainings
